Exiting the Circuit Breaker on 2 June

On 19 May 2020, the Government announced that Circuit Breaker measures will be gradually eased from 2 June 2020, and businesses will be allowed to resume activities in a phased manner. The following are salient points to note:

- Firms that operate in settings with lower transmission risks may resume activities. This includes most manufacturing, aerospace, and air transport businesses.
 - The list of businesses that can resume operations can be found in this infographic and at covid.gobusiness.gov.sg/permittedlist
 - Businesses permitted to resume do not need to apply for an exemption before resuming operations as a class exemption will be granted by MTI. However, businesses must submit manpower details via covid.gobusiness.gov.sg within two weeks of the date of resumption of operations.
- Employers must put in place safe management measures at the workplace, and employees must adhere strictly to them. Strict checks will be conducted.
 - Telecommuting should be adopted to the maximum extent i.e. those who have been working from home so far should continue to do so.
 - All businesses must comply with the requirements for Safe Management Measures and any sector-specific requirements which apply to them.

SGUnited Traineeship Programme

The SGUnited Traineeships Programme aims to provide fresh graduates from Polytechnics, Universities, the Institute of Technical Education (ITE), and others with traineeship opportunities across various sectors. Led by MOM and WSG, the programme aims to provide traineeship lasting up to 12 months to graduating cohorts in 2019 and 2020. This will help them develop industry-relevant skills, and boost their employability in preparation for economic recovery.

Host companies can gain access to a pool of fresh talent and be able to recruit from a pool of experienced trainees when the economy recovers (however, no commitment is necessary for host companies to hire after the traineeship). The government will fund 80% of the training allowance while the host company funds the remaining 20%. Training must commence by 31st Dec 2020.

Voice of Industry: AAIS in the News

In a recent interview with Channel NewsAsia, AAIS gave the following views on the state of the aerospace industry, and actions it has taken to facilitate and support members:

- The aerospace industry provides vital support to aviation, enabling planes to keep flying. 85% of the Singapore industry is involved in maintaining and repairing aircraft. Singapore also plays a small but critical role in the global aerospace supply chain. Our SMEs have a key role in MRO and manufacturing, supporting with special processes, tooling, testing, logistics, manpower, and other services.
- Today, more than 60% of the global aircraft fleet has been grounded by the pandemic. This has resulted in a direct impact on aerospace businesses here. The severe cuts or closures of Boeing and Airbus production lines in USA and Europe have also brought hardship for aerospace part manufacturers and their suppliers.
- AAIS has formed an Aerospace Covid-19 Taskforce. We have been collecting
 industry feedback to support government policymaking. We have also been
 facilitating information and experiencing sharing, and extending assistance to
 our members. Our open letter to the nation expresses the aerospace
 community's solidarity with our nation in efforts to tackle the COVID-19
 pandemic.
