

Fortitude Budget (26 May)

This afternoon, Deputy Prime Minister and Finance Minister Heng Swee Keat announced the \$33 billion Fortitude Budget, with additional and enhanced support measures to help businesses cope with the economic fallout of COVID-19. We are pleased to note the following points:

• Jobs Support Scheme

Firms in the Aerospace sector including those in Maintenance, Repair, and Overhaul (MRO), will now receive 75% of wage support. Eligible firms will receive a back-payment to top up their previous JSS payouts to the higher level of support. This retrospective payment will be made by July. Expanded Rental Relief

The government will provide cash grants to offset rental costs for SMEs, to be disbursed through property owners. Landlords are required to pass on the benefit to their SME tenants. Industrial, office, and agricultural tenants of Government agencies will receive one more month of rental waiver (ie. a total of two months of rental waiver). Businesses Facing Longer-term Challenges

DPM noted the following "(S)ome sectors, such as aviation and tourism, will take longer to re-open fully, given the restrictions on global travel for the foreseeable future. The Government will consider providing additional help, depending on the situation and longer-term shape of these industries, and plans for the economy. In the interim, I urge businesses to make good use of the existing support and consider how to transform for a post-COVID world."
