CAAS Freezes Aviation Fee Increase

To help mitigate the significant impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on the aviation industry, the Civil Aviation Authority of Singapore (CAAS) has announced that it will freeze the following scheduled fee increases for the period from 1 April 2020 to 31 March 2021:

- 1. Fees for inspection, testing or evaluation during the certification or approval process for the design, production or distribution of aircraft components or aircraft materials;
- 2. Fees for safety inspections during the certification or approval process for the maintenance of aircraft or aircraft components;
- 3. Fees for renewal of an approval, or certificate for inspection, overhaul, repair, replacement and modification of aircraft or aircraft components.

SG-M'sia Reciprocal Green Lane

Malaysia and Singapore will be implementing the Reciprocal Green Lane (RGL) and Periodic Commuting Arrangement (PCA). These two schemes are meant to address travel for essential business, work and official purposes between both countries. Officials in Malaysia and Singapore are working towards the targeted implementation of RGL and PCA on 10 August 2020.

Category 1: Reciprocal Green Lane (RGL)

Cross-border travel for essential business and official purposes between both countries. Travelers will be subject to swab tests and are expected to submit a controlled itinerary and adhere to this itinerary during their visit.

Category 2: Periodic Commuting Arrangement (PCA)

The PCA will allow Singapore and Malaysia residents, who hold long-term immigration passes for business and work purposes in the other country, to enter for work. After at least three consecutive months in their country of work, they may return to their home country for a short-term home leave, and thereafter re-enter their country of work for at least another three consecutive months.

Negotiations are still ongoing for daily commuting and border reopening.

Sustainability: JTC's SolarRoof Tender

Aligned with efforts to drive sustainability in partnership with the industry, JTC has launched a **SolarRoof tender** to help companies adopt solar energy and make industrial estates more environmentally friendly. This initiative aims to fast-track solar power adoption on the rooftops of 50 JTC buildings and those of JTC's lessees, spanning about 18ha. It is expected to create 15 megawatt-peak (MWp) of solar deployment by 2022.

Companies will be able to tap on this tender for economies of scale, and contract directly with the appointed solar PV vendor at zero capital outlay under the various solar deployment models. They could either lease solar photovoltaic panels and get a discount of about 15% on the electricity generated, or lease out part of their rooftop space for solar vendors to install solar panels, receiving revenue in return. To help companies better understand the benefits of solar adoption and the various solar deployment models/vendors, JTC will be sharing more details in its engagements and the upcoming Aerospace Community Dialogue. Guidance on Business Collaborations

In light of the disruption arising from the COVID-19 pandemic, businesses may need to temporarily collaborate to improve the supply of essential goods and services in Singapore. The Competition and Consumer Commission of Singapore (CCCS) has issued a <u>Guidance Note on Collaborations</u> <u>between Competitors in Response to COVID-19 Pandemic on 20 July.</u> This is intended to provide more clarity on permissible collaborations between competitors and give businesses confidence in pursuing such collaborations. COVID-19 BUSINESS COLLABORATION GUIDANCE NOTE



WHY ISSUE THIS GUIDANCE NOTE?

Due to the economic impact of COVID-19, competing businesses may find it necessary to work together to respond to disruptions in supply of essential goods or services.

WHAT IS ALLOWED?

CCCS will exceptionally assume that collaborations that fulfill the following are likely to generate net economic benefits and thus, are unlikely to infringe the Competition Act:

Sustain or improve the supply of essential goods or services in Singapore Are limited in scope and

Do not involve price-fixing, bid-rigging, market sharing or output limitation





FOR HOW LONG?

The Guidance Note applies to collaborations put in place from 1 February 2020, and which will expire by 31 July 2021.

WHAT IS PROHIBITED?

Collaborations that involve price-fixing, bid-rigging, market sharing or output limitation will continue to be prohibited unless they satisfy the net economic benefit criteria under the Third Schedule to the Competition Act.
