New Work-Study Diploma for RSAF NSFs

The Institute of Technical Education (ITE) and the Republic of Singapore Air Force (RSAF) have launched a new Work-Study Diploma (WSDip) in Aircraft Maintenance Engineering. This is the first WSDip programme for NSFs – which allows them to work as Air Force Technicians, serve their National Service, and attain a Diploma at the same time.

Under a Memorandum of Understanding signed on 22 September, ITE and RSAF will be collaborating with AAIS, SIA Engineering Company, ST Engineering Aerospace to develop the training curriculum for the programme. Graduates of the programme may sign on as regulars or pursue career opportunities in aircraft maintenance in the aerospace industry.

Industry Dialogue with Govt Agencies & Union

With the impact of COVID-19 to the air transport industry expected to last for some time, aerospace companies have been exploring ways to retain core capabilities, upskill their workforce, and reposition for the eventual recovery and upturn. To help members learn more about initiatives made available to help companies in the aerospace sector upskill their workers, AAIS organised a closed-door Industry Dialogue with government agencies and union representatives on 9 September 2020.

Representatives from the Economic Development Board (EDB), SkillsFuture Singapore (SSG), and Workforce Singapore (WSG) shared on manpower support initiatives including the new Enhanced Training Support Package for Aerospace and the Aerospace Professional Conversion Programme. The National Trades Union Congress (NTUC) covered Best practices for managing excess manpower and responsible retrenchment and the Employment and Employability Institute (e2i) shared about Outplacement support. We thank all the government and union representatives for their time and beneficial sharing.



First Virtual Networking Session for Members

AS 9100:2016 Internal Auditor Course

Singapore Airworthiness Requirements (SAR) Part 21
